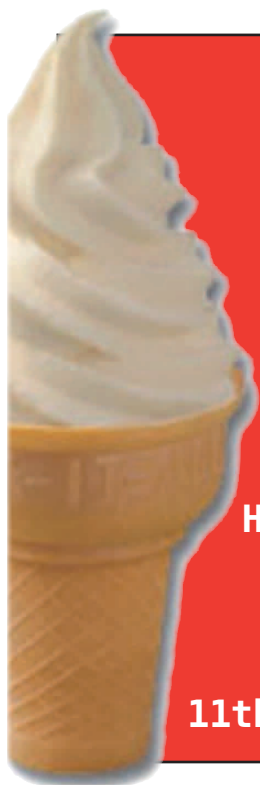

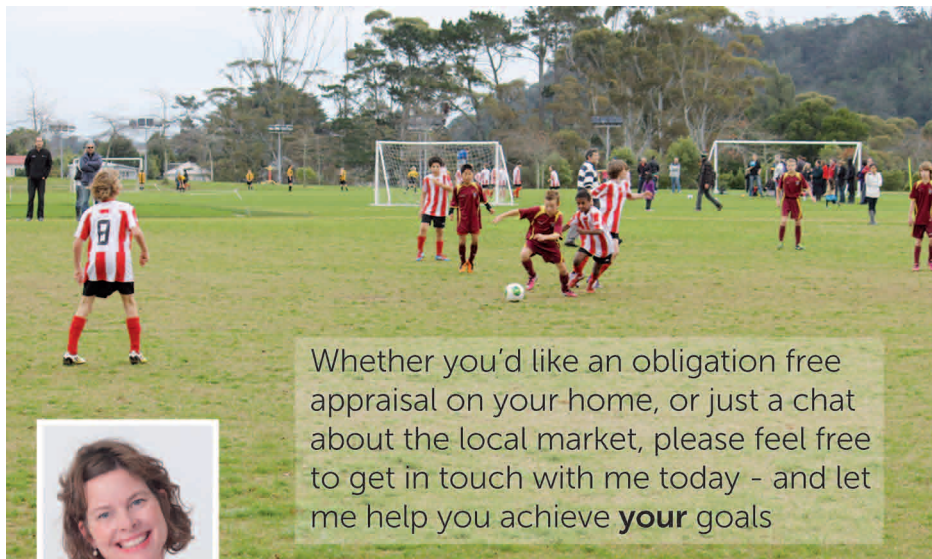

LADIES FOOTBALL 2013

LADIES DIVISION 1

9th June 2013 – vs. Hibiscus Coast: Result 4 v 0 win

Finally a game, after missing the last two weeks through postponements the ladies were champing at the bit to actually get on the field and play some football – and what an interesting field it was. One half firm and dry, the other covered in ankle deep water, which led to the necessity of adaptation and differing playing styles depending on where you were standing, dry ground = ball retention, fast passing game, attack at speed, wet side = chip and chase try and find some dry ground, and no mucking around with the ball.

The Birko ladies, who played into the pond first half, were by far the quickest team to adapt to the conditions and whether on the dry side or wet side of the halfway line completely dominated the play. Two of the team's younger players, Lorna Selby and Millie Hinchliffe, destroyed Hibiscus down the left hand side of the field with Lorna constantly skinning her marker and whipping in cross after cross, and Millie cleaning up any Hibiscus through balls and feeding the ball back into Lorna so she could attack again.

The first goal came about ten minutes before the half from a corner taken by Lorna, the cross being placed right on the keeper, who missed it, and travelled through the throng of players into the back of the net, Gill Lathwood was quick to put her hand up at half time to say the cross hit her fringe before going in the goal, the rest of us a still waiting for the video replay.

Leading into the second half, with the promise of a dry attacking half, it was only a matter of time before the Birko pressure began to take its toll. Michaela Carlson chipped the keeper from twenty five yards out from the right hand side of the park for the second, and Gill





Lathwood did likewise from the left hand side of the field, after a great first touch, for the third (and arguably her second for the day), Fiona Pierce put the icing on the cake with the fourth, a five yard tap in after another successful attack down the left hand side of the park.

A player of the day performance from Lorna Selby and an extremely successful return to the field after a two week break for the Birko ladies. This week we say goodbye to Melia Rosen who will complete her degree this week, and flying out for greener pastures, best of luck in your future.....

16th June 2013 – vs. Te Atatu Socialbelles: Result 2 v 1 Win

The opportunity to play on the number one pitch was only slightly dampened by the persistent rain fall, and truthfully due to the quality of the field the ladies ability to play their free flowing passing style of football wasn't hampered in the least.

In previous meetings with Te Atatu Socialbelles we have found them to be a physically dominating side reliant on smash and hack tactics, however it seems they have had a change in personnel with an injection of younger players who actually wanted to play football, which was refreshing from a coach's point of view.

During the game itself the Birko midfield completely dominated, with the ladies stringing numerous first touch passers together, passing around and through the opposition, turning them on their heels and tiring them out from chasing shadows, before sending the ball wide to exploit the width the field offers, and realistically the only thing that kept Te Atatu in the game was their goal keeper, who had a superb performance throughout the game.

Unfortunately such dominance created complacency in the Birko backline who found themselves sitting too square on two occasions in the first half, the first occasion Te Atatu broke through and earned themselves a penalty, which fortunately hit the cross bar and bounced nicely into the keepers hands, the second time the Te Atatu striker found herself one on one and blasted the ball through the keeper going one nil up. After having such dominance and going one nil down the Birko ladies were spurred up a gear and it wasn't long until Lorna Selby evened the scores with a twenty yard screaming.

As the second half progressed Birko's level of dominance increased with opportunity after opportunity being created, but again the Te Atatu keeper kept the scores even. With fifteen to go and no change in score line a formation change was required to make the difference, changing to a 3, 5, 2, formation which created an overlap and goal the ladies deserved. The goal itself was created by a beautiful display of midfield passing and a little bit of football magic and determination from Sarah Taylor who set up Lorna Selby to slot it home for her second of the day, and what turned out to be the winner. After the goal Te Atatu threw everything they had left at as but the ladies held on and came out with the three points I believe they deserved.

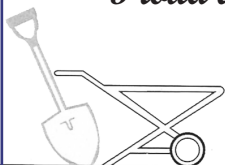

FUN FOOTBALL 2013

A couple of weeks ago we brought in the reserves and under 17 squads to help the coaches train our 6th grade players. The reason we do this is to connect the senior club to the junior club. It is also a way to engage our kids in football, they get to know our senior players and they want to play like them. This is a big piece in their development.

Also a big piece in their development is the parents who we get to coach. They put in a huge effort and some parents have very little or no football knowledge. Below is an article from a first time coach Andy Ballard who volunteered to coach this season. Coaching can be a real challenge, but it is incredibly rewarding.

6th Grade Burgundy – Andy Ballard

My son decided he wanted to play football two days after registration closed. When we called the club they weren't sure if they could fit him in but did mention they needed a 6th grade coach. Fast forward a few weeks and I'm coaching him and four other budding stars in a sport I was absolutely rubbish at and have hardly played for 30 years. I had the foresight to google "kids football drills" and got a vague idea of what I might do in our first session. I also watched a YouTube clip on refereeing so I knew the difference between the whistle for half time and full time. Yes, I knew the kids wouldn't care, but I thought the parents might.



I felt under enormous pressure during that first training session. Would they have fun? Would they learn something? How would their parents react? Would I remember their names? Luckily the answers were a resounding YES, probably, happy and mostly. I can't say they worked as a team but they did work. Each one of them tried so hard and they pulled off that motivational first win.

From then it was a case of building on each week's progress. In training I added a new drill each week and dropped the ones that weren't working or that the kids seemed to have mastered. I even stopped resorting to YouTube and started designing my own training games.

Week six was a critical one for the team. Two of our players were sick and not just any two but the two key goal-scorers who had scored over 80% of our goals between them. The opposition team kindly loaned us a player who seemed happy to don the burgundy shirt. Ironically losing our strikers was probably the best thing that could have happened for player development. The remaining boys discovered a goal instinct and impressed me with another win.

There've been lots of stories in the media about verbal and physical attacks on coaches,

even at midget grades. Coaches have been reported as feeling under-appreciated and unfairly criticised for their decisions. Thankfully I can say that has not been my experience at all at Birkenhead United. The parents are incredibly supportive and uncritical, especially given that most of them are surely far better players than me.

After seven weeks I actually have started to feel that I might know what I'm doing. The boys are all still having fun and so am I. I think we've only lost one game but I honestly can't be sure – it actually is about the playing and not the winning. I've happily accepted the moniker "coach Andy" and I feel I might even be earning it. The boys sometimes put into practice what we've done in training; this week they started passing. I think I might just put my hand up again next season :)

I would like to thank all our coaches in the club as it is you who make a great football experience for our players and the reason why our club is as strong as it is today. I can't wait to see more of our kids make it into our first team in years to come.
